About the First Day of School

The 2024-25 school year begins on Monday, August 26. Only ninth graders will attend classes on a shortened schedule. This will allow them to meet their teachers, learn their schedule and how to move throughout the building, and receive subject-specific technology training.

Grades 10-12 will come to school during the assigned times below to have their school picture taken and pick up their chromebook. Bus service will be available to ninth graders only; see times below.

- 1. Ninth graders will attend classes from 7:50 to 12 noon. It is a uniform day for ninth graders.
- 2. Buses will leave the campus at 12:10pm.
- 3. For grades 10-12, Monday, August 26 is a dress-up day and school picture day. Students may wear dress-up clothing that is modest and appropriate, or students can wear their uniforms. Denims, T-shirts, hats, tank tops, short skirts, short shorts, spaghetti straps, strapless dresses, or flip-flops are not appropriate attire.
- 4. All students are required to be in uniform beginning Tuesday, August 27. You can learn about AHA's uniform policy in our *Student and Parent Handbook* on the Holy Angels website. Go to www.academyofholyangels.org. Click on Student at the top and then Uniform Policy on the right.

Remember to complete your summer reading requirements by the first full day of school. Details are at www.academyofholyangels.org. Click on the Summer Reading link from Student menu in the upper right hand corner.

Uniforms for Physical Education Classes

Students taking PE courses will be required to wear the school-approved PE uniform, consisting of the logoed t-shirt and shorts. Students taking PE for the first time will be issued uniforms on their first day of PE class. The \$12 fee will be added to the student's TADS account.

School Photos

All grade 10, 11, and 12 students (as well as any 9th grade or transfer students who missed orientation) must have their school photos taken on the first day of school. Ninth graders will have their pictures taken and receive their student ID cards during orientation. Information from the photographer, Jostens, is included in this mailing. Families and students wishing to order photos can follow the instructions to order online. You do not need to return anything on picture day. Families not satisfied with the photos they ordered will have the opportunity to order new.

Senior Photos

Seniors may use their school photo for the yearbook, or they may choose a different photographer for their senior yearbook photo. However, the photo they submit must be a vertical head-and-shoulder shot, and it must be submitted to the yearbook website by November 4. The link for the senior photo submission can be found through the Senior Info page under Parents on the AHA website.

Student Technology

All students will again be issued a Chromebook and a plastic protective cover this fall. Students may choose their own backpack or bag in which to carry the device as long as it is protective. All students will receive the devices on either the first or second day of school. The school-issued device needs to be kept in good working order and condition. While normal wear and tear is expected, any excessive or repeated major damage will be charged to the family. Negligence is not excused. Damage should be reported to the helpdesk immediately. Major damage includes but is not limited to: drops which result in a shattered screen, broken body, or other cracked components, spills which can damage motherboard, keyboard or screen. Families do not pay for the first incident but will be notified via email when any major damage occurs. On the second incident, families will be notified and charged a \$25 fee to their tuition account. This resets each school year. Fees may increase for repetitive or excessive damage.

If your son or daughter checked out a Chromebook for this summer, remember it is due back to the helpdesk by 2 pm on Monday, August 12.

Class Schedules

Go to www.academyofholyangels.org/myaha or click on myAHA in the student or parent portal on the website. Returning students and all parents can log in to see schedules after August 15th. See the included myAHA handout for information about how to log in. New students will receive their login information on the first day of school. Parents can see their child's schedule by clicking on their student's name in the upper left-hand corner, then by clicking on the schedule tab in the menu.

Locker Numbers

Returning students can see locker numbers and combinations on the student profile in myAHA as soon as they have been updated by AHA administration, sometime mid-August. New students will receive this information on paper at orientation and can see it on the profile once they receive login info to myAHA on the first day of school.

Student ID/Print Cards

Students will be required to have their ID/print-copy cards with them in school and at home sports events, dances and activities. The student ID also serves as a print-copy card, which they'll swipe to pay for the costs of printing from a computer or making photocopies. Returning students who had positive balances in their print-copy accounts at the end of last year will find those balances still available for use. Students are responsible for adding funds to their card account when needed and can do so at the Stars Spirit school store before the start of the school day. All new students will start off with a \$10 balance, collected as an additional payment made with tuition, and will be shown on your TADS invoice.

This fall, all 9th graders will receive their ID card during the 1st week of school. 10th, 11th and 12th graders will receive theirs the 2nd week of school and they should plan to use their 23-24 Student ID until the new one arrives. Upperclassmen who lose their ID cards before they are issued a new one should go to the Stars Spirit school store before the start of the school day to get a replacement card at a cost of \$15.

Lunch Accounts

Parents of new students will receive an email in mid-August from "Edutrack Admin" through Taher Food Service with directions about setting up an online lunch account that can be used to check the lunch balance and monitor transactions. A separate account called "e-funds for schools" can be set up to electronically deposit funds into the lunch account. The welcome email will include your family key, which is needed to set up the account. If you need your student's ID number, it can be viewed on your student's contact card in myAHA. Families can also send checks or cash to the school with students or via mail.

For Seniors As a reminder, all AHA seniors are required to have their 2nd **Meningococcal ACWY immunization** at the start of the school year.

Daily Schedules

The daily schedule is built with three, 7-period days and two days of extended time learning.

Unless a late start or early dismissal, the other start/stop times for the day remain the same, 7:50am-2:40pm.

The daily schedules used are as follows:

- Regular Schedule periods 1-7
- Blue Schedule periods 1-4, extended time
- Gold Schedule periods 5-7 with homeroom, extended time
- Mass Schedule
- Early Dismissal- 1pm dismissal
- Late Start- 8:25am start
- Stars Schedule- asynchronous learning days

Attendance Information

If your student is ill or will be absent from school, call the direct-dial Attendance Line 612-798-0760 or email attendance@ahastars.org. (Please do not call the main office about attendance matters.) If you need to speak to Attendance Clerk Mrs. Sackmaster personally, call 612-798-2640.

Parents/guardians should contact the school by **10:00 a.m**. the day of the absence. Students involved in cocurricular activities who are absent or arrive after 10 a.m., or are sent home during the school day due to illness or for disciplinary reasons, may not practice, compete or perform in their activity for that day. The Athletic or Activities Directors handle exceptions to this policy.

Students leaving during the school day for an appointment will be required to provide supporting documentation. Those failing to do so will be ineligible for after school athletics and activities for that day. Additional school consequences including but not limited to loss of Off-Campus and Detention will also apply to students who cannot provide supporting documentation.

A reminder that on PLC/Late Start days, students are to be in their period 1 class by 8:25 a.m. It is strongly recommended that students still leave for school at their regular time as traffic is often busier the later it gets. Students who arrive before 8:25 a.m. can socialize or study in the gym, the commons, or study in the library.

If your child is TARDY to school:

- Students who arrive at school between 7:50 a.m. 8:15 a.m. are tardy and must sign in at the Convocation Center lobby desk and list the arrival time. Students who arrive after 8:15 a.m. are considered absent and must also sign in and will be issued a pass to class.
- A written excuse, email, or a call to the Attendance line is required when students are absent. Otherwise, the periods missed are considered skips.

Trimester limits on absences and tardies:

- Absences: Within a trimester, a student who misses more than eight (8) periods in any one class for
 nonschool sponsored events might not receive credit for that class. Non-school sponsored events include
 family vacations, illness, medical appointments, driver license exams, college visits, weather delays, club
 sports, and suspensions. Students who exceed the eight-absence-per-trimester limit will still be excused if they
 have a doctor's excuse due to a serious illness.
- Tardies: Students receiving seven (7) tardies to any period will be contacted by the Attendance Office as will their parents. Each additional tardy will result in the student being marked absent from the class. This absence is included in the eight-absence limit. When a student reaches eight tardies to any class within a trimester and/or has established a pattern of absenteeism, the student may not be allowed to attend practice on a date to be specified by the Athletic or Activities Directors. Each tardy after eight will result in sitting out another practice.

Special Permits - Plan Ahead!

- Students need a pass to leave school for a portion of the day for appointments or non-school related events. These absences are included in the student's eight-absence-per-trimester limit (see above).
- Parents should call the attendance line, email or send a written note if the student needs to leave during the school day. The student should pick up their special permit pass from the Attendance Clerk in the Convocation Center Lobby before school begins. Students are not allowed to leave school without a pass. Parents can pick students up outside the Convocation Center entrance.

Extended Absence Forms:

- Family vacations and other non-school related events lasting more than two days must be approved one week in advance.
- Students must provide a written or verbal request from a parent/guardian to the Attendance Office. They will receive an Extended Absence form that must be signed by a parent/guardian, each of the student's teachers, and the principals. This form must be completed and submitted to the Attendance Office before the student leaves for the vacation or event. These absences are included in the eight-absence limit.

Student and Parent Handbook Points of Emphasis 2024-2025

Our 2024-2025 Student and Parent Handbook is on our Website. You can see it by going to www.academyofholyangels.org, clicking on either the Students or the Parents tab, and then on the Student and Parent Handbook link.

When you review the handbook, please pay special attention to the following sections, they are especially important for students and parents to know:

Cellular phones

- Cellular phone use by students is not allowed during the school day (7:50 a.m. 2:40 p.m.).
- Cell phones need to be turned off and should be left in the student's car or stored securely in their locker.
- Students found using their cell phone or taking it out during the school day will have it confiscated by staff and turned over to the Assistant Principal.
- A parent/guardian is required to pick up the cell phone from the main office after school between 2:45 p.m. - 3:30 p.m.
- Students are no longer able to retrieve the cell phone from the Assistant Principal after school.
- If family circumstances require that students be available by cell phone during the school day, families can make arrangements by contacting the Assistant Principal.

Cell Phone Use in Bathrooms/Locker Rooms

- Cameras/video cameras are not allowed in locker rooms, bathrooms, shower areas or any other area where privacy is an expectation.
- Cameras on computers, phones or other devices are not allowed to be turned on in locker rooms.
- Consequences for using a cell phone in one of the above areas include, but are not limited to, loss of senior off-campus privileges, suspension, and dismissal from the Academy of Holy Angels.

Messages - How to Contact Your Student

As noted above, students are not allowed to use their cell phones during the day. Calls or texts to a student's phone disrupts the educational process. If a parent needs to reach their student, they should contact the main office and leave a message. The student will be contacted at the next passing period. The Assistant Principal will give permission for a student to use their cell phone if contacted by a parent or guardian, and only in the case of an emergency.

Why The Emphasis on Phones?

Students perform better in class! There are countless studies showing increased productivity, attention, and performance in class. Studies have also found a 62% increase in note taking during class, higher test scores, and more interaction during class compared to classrooms where cell phones were allowed.

Parents, please help us model the AHA Way by being Part of the Solution.

Other Information - Lockers

Students must use the locker they are assigned and are not to switch or share lockers during the school year. Students are responsible for the condition and contents of their assigned lockers.

Lockers should be used to store coats, jackets, blankets and other non-uniform items. Additionally, students who bring cell phones into the school building will need to store their cell phones, turned off, in their locker.

Student lockers are the property of Holy Angels and, as such, the locker and its contents are subject to inspection at any time.

Tobacco/E-cigarettes/Vaping

AHA is a tobacco-free campus all year and at all events. Smoking and use of tobacco including e-cigarettes and vaping delivery systems are not permitted on campus or at school-sponsored events. Students found with tobacco, an e-cigarette or a vaping delivery system will be suspended. They must complete a Urine Toxicology Screening and results sent to AHA. All substances identified in the student's system through the screening will be addressed per school policy. MSHSL and AHA Leadership penalties will also be applied.

Uniforms - General Information

Why Does AHA Have a Uniform Policy?

The uniform code was established to break down socioeconomic barriers between students, promote unity and pride in one's self and one's classmates and strengthen the overall image of the Academy of Holy Angels. A student's appearance may not draw undue attention to him or herself that disrupts the operations of the school.

As a Catholic, college preparatory high school, our values and faith are of the utmost importance. This includes modesty, professionalism, and preparing for the future. The uniform is designed with this in mind, so that our students can perform at their best academically, spiritually, and socially.

Additionally, when students are in uniform, it increases safety at school. It allows students and staff to identify guests in the building and create a unified sense of security.

Where Can I Buy Uniforms for My Student?

Uniform apparel must be purchased through Donald's Uniform, the sole uniform provider for AHA. All clothing is washable and dryable, with various fabric materials. Donald's purchases uniforms from manufacturers certified to be in strict compliance with all generally accepted international workplace standards, local laws, and workplace regulations. There are several ways to acquire the uniform pieces: at the Donald's stores or via Donald's website at: www.donaldsuniform.com.

Donald's has two locations - 972 Payne Ave., St. Paul MN 55130 and 4 Shady Oak Road, Hopkins MN 55343.

Students Wearing a Brace or Cast

If a student is wearing a brace or a cast as the result of an injury and feels that he or she is unable to wear uniform apparel because of the brace or cast, the student must see the Dean of Students or Assistant Principal to receive permission to be out of uniform. Every effort must be made to keep students in uniform even when they are wearing a brace or cast.

Used Uniforms

Academy of Holy Angels has used uniform garments including various shirts, shorts, skirts and skorts in different sizes. Stock is very limited and is dependent on donations. As such, priority will be given to students who are experiencing financial hardship. Used uniforms will be available on Friday, August 16th from 11:00am-noon following 9th Grade/Transfer Student Orientation. They will also be available by appointment the week of August 19th-23rd. Please contact Assistant Principal, Timothy Wolfgram via email at twolfgram@ahastars.org, for more information.

2024-2025 Uniform Points of Emphasis

Please maintain uniform clothing in a presentable manner. Students must wear correctly sized clothing. No ripped, cut, faded or torn items may be worn.

Other optional logo items include fleece wear, sweaters, and vests. Uniform-approved AHA athletic and activity crew-neck sweatshirts and 1/4 zip pullovers purchased through athletic or activity captains and any approved uniform sweatshirt sold in Stars Spirit store also can be worn as part of the uniform.

Please review the Uniform Policy in its entirety as found in the Student & Parent Handbook.

Some points of emphasis this year are noted below:

Girls

- Skirts, skorts, and shorts must be no shorter than 2 inches from the top of the kneecap.
- If students do not have skirts or skorts that are appropriate length, they will be required to wear navy or black leggings under the skirt or skort.
- Leggings must be navy or black and must be solid in color. Cutouts and mesh are not allowed.

Boys

- Shorts must be no shorter than 2 inches from the top of the kneecap
- Shorts and pants cannot be rolled up.
- Royal blue and black colored sweatshirts and pullovers, even purchased in the school store or ordered by a team, cannot be worn during the school day.
- All shorts and pants <u>MUST</u> be Donald's brand. Under Armour, Nike, etc., and other brands are not allowed.

Students must be in uniform the entire school day. Being in uniform is wearing the appropriate attire in the appropriate manner (e.g. shirt tucked in). The uniform policy is enforced from 7:50 a.m. - 2:40 p.m., Monday through Friday. It also is in effect on field trips and other designated AHA events.

Uniform Fines

A student is fined \$10 for being out of uniform without prior permission, or they can serve a Saturday detention. This includes, but is not limited, to wearing the uniform incorrectly or not adhering to the standards of the uniform policy. Failure to serve detention results in the fine. After the third offense, Saturday detention is not an option, and all offenses receive a \$10 fine.

Boys who are not wearing Donald's brand shorts will be fined - charged to the student's account - and given proper shorts from the uniform closet. Leggings will be provided to girls whose skirts/skorts are of an inappropriate length. The cost will be charged to the student's account instead of a uniform fine.

What can I do in myAHA right now?

1. Log in

- b. Enter your email address and click Next.
- c. If you are creating this account for the first time, you have the option to continue with your email (and a unique password) or use a google or apple login. If you used *myAHA* last year or for the admissions process, continue with the same credentials (password, google or apple), that you previously set up.
- d. If you've forgotten your password, request to have a link to reset it sent to you from that second screen.
- e. If you have difficulty logging in or do not remember the email you provided us, please email helpdesk@ahastars.org for help.

2. Review and submit any school forms that have been assigned to you.

- a. If it appears, click on the yellow banner at the top that says "you have x(s) forms to review" and review and submit any forms. You will have the emergency contact form to review and the Acknowledgement of AHA Medication Policy.
- b. AHA uses these electronic forms throughout the year for field trips, retreats, and other permissions as needed. Most only need one parent signature but are available to all parents until one has signed. Occasionally a form will also need a student signature and the student does that through their own myAHA login. It will be noted in the form if more than one signature is needed.
- c. Most forms are set up to send you email reminders as the due date approaches.
- 3. Look up and update contact information on the student contact card. Click on your student's name in the upper left hand corner once you are logged in and navigate to the Contact Card. Click on the pencil to update any information for your student. Please know that any name you put in the "preferred name" field for your student will replace their given first name on teacher rosters and other areas of the system. Only enter a name there if your child wishes that to be used instead of their given name.

- 4. **Update parent information**. Click on your name in the upper right hand corner and click profile. You'll see pencils next to the fields you can change.
- 5. Change how you want to be notified from this system and change your privacy settings.
 - a. Click on your name in the upper right hand corner and click settings. Then under Notifications, choose what you want to be notified about and how. If you enter your cell phone number, you can choose to be notified by text.
 - b. You will also see options for privacy settings in that area.
 - c. One notification many parents find helpful is the one for *missing assignments*. This is automatically sent when a teacher manually enters the letter M for an assignment grade.
- 6. **Check out the Family Directory**. On the home page, click on "Directories" then "Family Directory."
 - a. **Search for a particular person:** Type in a first or last name to see results of enrolled students and parents.
 - b. **Search by a field:** Click on "Include all fields" and then type in a city or zipcode to search by that field. *This may be helpful in setting up a carpool.*
 - c. **Print:** Click on the print icon and then another option to generate printable copies
 - d. **Limit your info:** You have control over which of your own information appears in the directories in the privacy section under settings. Note that each family member sets this info separately.
- 7. **See student ID number** on the student's contact card. New families will need this to set up the lunch accounts.
- 8. After August 15, see first trimester student schedules under the schedule tab after clicking on your child's name in the upper left hand corner. New students will receive their schedules on paper when they attend orientation.
- 9. **Get a tour of the system** by clicking on your name in the upper right hand corner, then choose "Getting started."
- 10. **Review other AHA-created Parent Resources** on the AHA website by clicking on parent at the top, then myAHA resources in the vertical menu.

New students log in to *myAHA* with their AHA google account and they will receive that login information on the first day of school. Email helpdesk@ahastars.org with any questions.

Busing and parking permits:

If you have not signed up for busing or a parking permit and would like to be considered for either one, you need to sign up soon. If you signed up on TADS, you do not need to sign up again. *Please try not to sign up twice*.

Busing:

If you signed up for busing and do not get a notification of your bus stop information by August 5th, please contact us immediately. If you get information about your bus stop and you no longer require busing, please let us know as soon as possible. Thank you for your help.

The buses leave from the church lot next door at 2:50pm on a regular schedule.

Parking forms:

You can print a form for a parking permit from the AHA website. Under the Admissions section, there is a Transportation tab. Click on it and then scroll down, open the parking permit form to print it. Fill it out and return to the Transportation Dept. You can also leave the form at the lobby desk or the main office. To be put in the lottery for permits, the due date is **August 5th**. After that you will be added to the waiting list. Permits are \$185.

<u>Please do not sign up for a parking permit if you do not yet have a</u> license to drive.

School district reimbursement for transportation costs:

Many school districts reimburse our families for some of the cost of transporting your children to and from school. Holy Angels will do everything we can to apply for reimbursement of some of your costs to transport your students; whether you provide your own transportation or you use our buses. School districts have a formula they use to calculate the amounts for refunds. Part of the formula is based on days of attendance.

Districts require a form (on AHA website under transportation) to be on file at Holy Angels. If it is not on file, they can deny reimbursing a family. Even if you filled out the form for prior years, please send a new copy for each year. The proper forms need to be filled out and filed in the appropriate place.

The exceptions: The Bloomington, Shakopee, South St Paul, Prior Lake / Savage School Districts have their own forms and want their form sent to them. If you reside in these districts, their forms should be mailed to your homes. We have also put some on our website. You will mail their forms to their address.

The school district in which you live will usually process these requests shortly after the end of each school year. Some districts send the monies directly to the families, while others send the monies to AHA. If AHA gets the check, we apply the amount to TADS accounts.

Reimbursement exceptions:

Minneapolis, Richfield, North St. Paul / Maplewood do not reimburse transportation costs. Do not worry about filling out the form and sending it to AHA. St. Paul only reimburses families that utilize the school bus option of transportation. Send form to AHA only if you ride the bus to and / or from school.
